

Cooperative Understanding Addendum - Storage

Between SMARC and the Greater Ozarks Chapter of the American Red Cross

Purpose:

This document further details the provision for storage space to be made available pursuant to the Cooperative Understanding signed between the two organizations in June 1989. Cooperative Understanding states "The American Red Cross [will] offer room in its facility to house equipment which can be used for disaster communications."

The American Red Cross will:

Provide storage space to SMARC for equipment and supplies which can be used for disaster communications. The amount and location of storage space will be determined by the Director of Emergency Services. Obviously, needs of the American Red Cross will have priority. Space provided is subject to change based on the needs of American Red Cross program(s). No equipment may be stored in the "radio room" that is not directly owned or leased by the American Red Cross. No fee shall be charged for this storage. Efforts will be made to afford reasonable access to stored equipment.


SMARC will:

Limit their storage of equipment and supplies to the space provided and keep it in a reasonably organized fashion. They will keep the Director of Emergency Services informed of changing needs of SMARC as it relates to the storage of equipment. Requests for additional storage space should be made in writing (or via email) from the SMARC President to the Director of Emergency Services. SMARC will hold the American Red Cross harmless from all damage or theft of equipment. The American Red Cross shall, in no way, be liable for any SMARC equipment stored on the premises.


Changes in Storage Space:

The Director of Emergency Services for the American Red Cross will attempt to provide the SMARC President 30 days notice (if at all possible) of any changes in storage availability. Some conditions may exist that prevent such advanced notice. Any and all notice of changes will be made in writing (or via email). If equipment is not removed within 96 hours following the removal deadline, it will be considered abandoned by SMARC and become property of the American Red Cross.
